

# 1 Scope

## This International Standard specifies the location of back windows of roll film cameras in relation to the number of exposures and film sizes they are designed to accommodate.

# 2 Back window location

The locating dimensions shown in Figure 1 are given in Table 1.

- 3 Centre line of spool
- 4 Centre line of aperture

Dimensions in millimetres

| Trade designation of nominal negative size | Exposure per roll film size | X      | Y      |
|--|-----------------------------|--------|--------|
| $4,5 \times 6$                             | 16 - 120                    | 0      | + 18,0 |
| 6 × 6                                      | 12 - 120                    | 0      | 0      |
| 6 × 9                                      | 8 - 120                     | + 35,5 | - 19,5 |

The tolerance for dimensions X and Y are  $\pm$  1,6 mm.

The diameter of the back window is 9,0 mm minimum.
